



WHAT'S COOKIN' OZAUKEE COUNTY: RAISED COFFEE CAKE

Ingredients: Topping:

2 cents worth yeast ¼ cup butter

1 cup water ¼ cup cocoanut (coconut)

½ cup sugar 1 cup flour

2 eggs ½ cup sugar

½ cup butter and lard, melted Melted butter and cinnamon for


1 heaping teaspoon salt finishing

2¾ quarts flour

Directions:

- 1. Dissolve half of the yeast in a little milk.
- 2. Add half the milk and water and enough flour to make a thick batter.
- 3. Let rise until light.
- 4. Then add salt, sugar, butter and lard, and the rest of the milk, the two eggs, and the remainder of the yeast, dissolved.
- 5. Add 2¾ quarts flour, and work dough with hands or spoon (do not knead it) until it leaves hands and dish free from dough.
- 6. Cover and set in warm place to rise.
- 7. When light and spongy, butter pans, cover with dough and let rise one-half hour or more.
- 8. Brush with white of egg and sprinkle with the following mixture:
- 9.Melt ¼ cup each of butter and lard
- 10. Add ¼ cup cocoanut, 1 cup flour, and ½ cup sugar
- 11. Rub between hands until crumbly, then strew on top of cake.
- 12. Over this, sprinkle a little melted butter and cinnamon.





CABOOSE PROJECT—BACK ON TRACK!

The OCHS "Caboosters" are very hopeful that the 1940 Milwaukee Road Ribside Caboose Restoration Project will be completed this fall! The project started in 2022. The deconstruction, asbestos abatement, welding, and exterior painting was completed in 2023. The subfloor, walls and windows were completed in 2024. Eddie Arguello used the original blueprints and design of the windows from the Milwaukee Road. They turned out beautiful.

Unfortunately, we had issues with the windows leaking which stalled the project for several months this year. After researching industrial sealants and gaskets, the issue was resolved so Tom Van Groll and Paul Olson moved forward with completing the fir flooring.

Over the winter, Greg Ziegler, worked on the reversible seats. He borrowed seats from the 1941 Milwaukee Road caboose owned by the Brohead Historical. The seat cushions were fabricated by Tom Gentz. We worked with aluminum Foundry of Wisconsin to mold and make the metal side pieces that are attached to the cushion frame. Mike Hecker built the conductor desk in his basement over the winter, too.







Mary Ann Velnetske primed the flooring so the lockers and toilet room could be framed in. A quick aside, on an engineering change order, the team learned that the toilet was replaced in 1975 with a contained flush toilet. Because the team is determined to restore the caboose to its original 1940 design, Greg Zielger, constructed a new toilet designed like the one from 1940.

The 1975 flush toilet was sold at auction for \$55!







