### What's Playing? ~ AUDIOPHILE RECORDS Inc.

For over 20 years (1947-1969), **AUDIOPHILE Records Inc. from Saukville, Wisconsin**, recorded the music of different genres, including Dixieland, Jazz and Easy Listening. At the same time, sound recordings were produced under this label, featuring "Echoes of the Storm" (AP-20), which includes recording the biggest thunderstorm that occurred in Milwaukee in 1952. This musical and technological adventure was the product of a visionary man named Ewing D. Nunn (1900-1976), inventor, entrepreneur and above all, fan of good music and believer in high fidelity sound recording. These records, in their beautifully red ruby color, are part of a catalog composed of hundreds of albums, and their story is something that the Oscar Grady Public Library is eager to share. Martin Morante, Library Assistant II, Adult & Teen Services at the library, will talk about some of the history behind one of Ewing D. Nunn's greatest achievements and legacy.



Thank you to the Wayne Luft Family for a unique **August Quarterly Meeting** held at their family "stone barn" in the town of Fredonia.


The barn was "full" of interested onlookers as Wayne shared the history of the construction and the history of the early settlers, the "Ruhland" family.



1830-1990

## END OF THE YEAR GIVING CHECKLIST

It's hard to believe that 2/3rd of 2018 is already history! But, there is still a lot of time before the end of the year to make charitable gifts to your favorite charities, and we hope that the Ozaukee County Historical Society (OCHS) is right up there at the top!!!

Here are some ideas to maximize your giving impact and potentially minimize your 2018 tax bill as you help "saving yesterday for today and tomorrow" through your financial support of the Ozaukee County Historical Society:

### 1. Give where needed

If you want the simplest choice, consider making a non-designated gift to where it is most needed. OCHS offers a wide variety of ways that you can make a difference. Your gifts will support historical educational programs, such as those developed and directed specifically for school children, or help to maintain and preserve the vast OCHS library and archives of the history and people who lived and worked to build Ozaukee County through the past 170+ years.

Or, your gift could help to maintain the variety of structures the historical society owns and maintains, from the historic Interurban Depot that serves as the OCHS headquarters and archive center, to the many historic structures in the OCHS Pioneer Village.

Your one-time or on-going gifts will help the Ozaukee County Historical Society to continue to make available and maintain our historic Pioneer Village, a collection of over 24 buildings, including log cabins, half timber structures, barns and houses from the 1860s to the 1930s. Included is the historic Cedarburg Rail Station, meticulously restored to its original significance and glory as one of many of the prominent structures in the history of Ozaukee County.

### 2. Give someone else's money too

Hundreds of companies across the country match or partially match employee contributions to 501(c)(3) nonprofit organizations such as the Ozaukee County Historical Society. That effectively could double your donation without you giving another cent!

Just contact your employer to see if they will match your donations and find out how it works. Some employers even match contributions made by their retired workers, so it makes sense to check.

### 3. "Double" your tax break

Did you know you can probably double your tax break by donating appreciated assets such as stock or real estate to OCHS?

During 2018, the stock market has been booming! If you have stock that has grown in value, you can donate shares of stock to OCHS and should receive a charitable deduction for the current value as well as eliminate capital gains tax on the appreciation.

Another option would be to consider making a gift of real estate and you'll receive a charitable deduction for the current value as well as eliminate capital gains tax.

### 4. Make a gift that will last forever

Consider making a legacy gift to create an endowment that will continue to ensure that the history of Ozaukee County is provided for in the future. Your gift could allow OCHS to maintain one or more of the historic structures in Pioneer Village or the historic Interurban Depot.

### 5. Remember the deadline


Your gifts to OCHS must be completed by midnight on December 31, 2018, in order to receive a charitable deduction for the 2018 tax year. Keep in mind that gifts of stocks or other securities may take two to three weeks to process at year-end. Remembering our history is important.
